Sunday Readings: Isaiah 53:10–11 The Lord's will shall be accomplished through him. / **Hebrews 4:14–16**...Let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help. / **Mark 10:35–45** [Jesus said,] "For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

We might forgive James and John for their ambition. They had, after all, been with Jesus since the beginning. They had seen him heal the ill, cast out demons, and preach about repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Surely Jesus had a power that no one else had. And surely he would give it away to those who asked for it. James and John make a mistake. They thought power and greatness have to do with position.

We are so like them. We often think that people are great if they have abundant wealth or prestigious titles. We consider them powerful if they have higher or several degrees, or if the world judges them to be attractive. And the world tells us this is so. But Jesus has a different message. Greatness has nothing to do with wealth or education. Sitting at the right and left hand of Jesus does not depend on appearance, position, or accomplishments. Rather, greatness comes from being willing to empty yourself for the sake of others. Our power lies in being the least among our

neighbors.

Jesus challenges us in this reading. He dares us to let go of our ideas of greatness and to become servants of all. He invites us to "do the lesser things" with no strings attached or expectation of reward. (*Ministry* comes from the Latin *minus/minor* and Greek *meion*, meaning "less, smaller.") We must serve in love out of love for him. This week, look for little things you can do for others, giving thanks to God for this invitation.





There's something new coming to Saint Anne's. You've probably noticed the big Loraas bin in the parking lot and the tables of free stuff in the welcome area. This is part of a plan to make a few changes to better use our church building. In the coming months, you'll see the following changes:

- 1. A space for nursing moms in the staff room: We want mothers to be comfortable nursing their babies wherever and however is best for them. Often, this means nursing babies in the church or welcome area, and mothers are always welcome to do that. We've also heard that at times, mothers would prefer a more quiet and private space, so we're setting up a comfortable space in the staff room. Our goal is provide sound from the church to that room, so those using it can continue to participate by listening to the Mass.
- 2. The Art and Environment room moving closer to the church: Our current Art and Environment room is on the far side of the hall. This means our dedicated team of decorators has to carry all of the church décor across the hall and into the church. To make their lives a little easier, we are converting the storage space in the hallway that leads to the men's bathroom into a new Art and Environment room.
- 3. A new living room-style space in the old Art and Environment room: On a lot of evenings, every room in the church is in use, and sometimes groups meet in offices or homes due to lack of space. Also, a lot of our meeting space is set up as meeting rooms, which works well for committee planning meetings but isn't always the best space for prayer and faith sharing. This new room will be set up as a more homey, comfortable space for faith sharing and prayer.

We are still working out details and pricing, and we'll provide a cost estimate as soon as one is available. As with everything we do here, we commit to doing this work in a way that is cost effective, high quality, and for the best service to the parish as a whole.
