SYRIAN REFUGEE FAMILY UPDATE:

It has been just over 13 months since the arrival of our Syrian refugee family, the Bazarjian family, arrived in Saskatoon. The one year anniversary also marked the completion of our official sponsorship of the family as a church community. St. Anne's Parish in partnership with St. Martyrs Canadiens and Resurrection Lutheran Church sponsored the family of 7 individuals consisting of the father (Makerdij), mother (Darine), children (Anna, Maki and Vartan), grandmother (Maki) and great aunt (Annahid). The year was marked by a number of events including the funeral of the great aunt Annahid, who died at 84 years of age. We have also offered prayers during our mass intentions during the last several months for the grandmother, Maki Zeroun, for her improved health. As a committee, we celebrated each of the children's birthdays as a social occasion to recognize these as important milestones with a birthday party. As a private sponsor of the refugee family, we fulfilled our financial obligation in covering the expenses for the family for their first year in Canada. We are truly grateful for the generosity of parishioners from the 3 churches that enabled the Ecumenical Refugee Committee to raise \$50,000 that has been used throughout the year for expenses that have included rent, food, utilities, bus passes and even unanticipated medical costs. We express our gratitude to parishioners and committee members who contributed furniture, clothing, gifts, and transportation to appointments to the family throughout the year. Committee member Carmen Koss was instrumental as a committee member as she served as a translator for the family. We would also like to take the opportunity as a committee to acknowledge the generosity of Dr. Mark Gryba who provided dental services to the family pro bono.

The transition of the family from our committee support to follow-up with the Open Door Society has been taking place over the past several weeks. The family continues to live in a duplex in Silverwood. The girls have been attending St. Angela School for their second year at the school. Both girls are currently enrolled in First Communion and Confirmation classes at St. Anne's Parish. Vartan, the 2 year old son attends daycare at the Open Door Society while his mother, Darine, continues to take English classes at the Open Door Society. The father, Makerdij, has been enrolled in the SIAST English program full-time this fall. Makerdij has been casually employed over the last few months with a carpet cleaning business. He has not secured stable employment as yet in his chosen area of installation of solar panel technology. We feel that to truly provide him with stable employment opportunities his English needs to continue to improve. We have explored as a committee applications for social assistance support for the family but they are not currently eligible as yet.

We thank volunteers such as Betty Jmaeff from St. Anne's Parish who have continued to provide the family with opportunities for the children to learn English as a family. We have continued to maintain contact with the family as we wind down our official sponsorship relationship with them. Makerdij has already discovered that he loves fishing and he has invited us to join him. We thank the parishioners of St. Anne's Parish for your past and continued prayers of support for the Bazarjian family.

RECONCILIATION SERIES

Our Reconciliation Series continues. Saint Anne's Truth and Reconciliation Committee is hosting movie nights, to watch and discuss the APTN docuseries, *First Contact*. We have watched one episode but you are welcome to join us for the remaining episodes **November 22, and 29**, starting at 7:00 pm in the Fr. Donlevy Hall at St. Anne's Church.

What is *First Contact*? Many Canadians have not had the opportunity to get to know Indigenous Peoples or visit their communities. Through this three-part docuseries, which aired on Aboriginal Peoples Television Network (APTN) in Sept 2018, the creators aim to do just that.

First Contact takes six average Canadians, all with strong opinions about Indigenous Peoples, on a 28-day journey into Indigenous Canada. It is a journey that challenges perceptions and confronts opinions about being Indigenous Canadian.

With the viewing of *First Contact*, we hope to inspire greater awareness of the history and current lives of Indigenous Peoples across Canada, and encourage dialogue and engagement around Indigenous issues.
