Sunday Readings

2 Kings 4:42–44: [Elisha said,] “Thus says the LORD: You will eat and have some left over.”

Ephesians 4:1–6: I, then, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live...with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love.

John 6:1–15: Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining.

Gifts to be Shared

The multiplication of the loaves and fish was a scene commonly sculpted on the tombs of Christians in ancient Rome. These early Christians, an ocean away, not only heard the story but believed it and sealed their lives with it. What powerful message of life and death did they find? Aside from being a symbol of the Eucharist, the center of early Christian worship then as today, this miracle is a call to generosity. By giving your life to Jesus, he can multiply it and raise it up to new life.

Jesus sees the hunger of the crowd and wants to satisfy them. He asks what provisions they have, and all they can muster is two fish and five loaves. Andrew questions what good that is for so many. Implicit is that it may be better to save what little there is for themselves.

Jesus sees things differently. He gives thanks for the little they have and has the apostles give it away. He knows the Father will multiply this generosity. Rather than look at what they have as a scarcity of goods, he sees them as gifts to share.

This is the radical change of heart that Jesus asks of us. Everything we have is a gift to be shared. When we live in love, and not in selfish fear of how to satisfy ourselves, then God multiplies what little we have and provides everything we need.

When the Gospel declares the apostles had collected twelve baskets of leftovers, the text shouts that God is a God of abundance, not of scarcity.

Updates to diocesan Safeguarding Action Plan and Historical Case Review results are announced: Bishop Mark Hagemoen July 21 released results of an independent Historical Case Review Process that examined past cases of serious misconduct and sexual abuse in the diocese over the years. In conjunction with those results, the diocese also announced updates to its Safeguarding Action Plan. The report has been posted at <https://redos.ca/safer-church> and shared with parishes across the diocese.

A Safeguarding Advisory Committee established three years ago by Bishop Mark Hagemoen recommended a review of diocesan records as part of the release of a *Safer Church, Safer Communities* Safeguarding Action Plan in March 2020. "The key goal of our plan was that our diocese and our churches be places of profound respect and safety for all peoples – especially the young and vulnerable," said Bishop Hagemoen in a letter to the diocese July 21.

The historical review report lists nine cases involving serious misconduct by either clergy or lay employees working in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon, however no new names of abusers were released. Two non-historical cases still under review were also noted in the Historical Case Review report, with previously-released names again published.

"To any person in our diocese or beyond who has experienced abuse by clergy or anyone else in the Church, I again express my profound sorrow and I apologize for what you have suffered, and for the betrayal, violation, and abandonment you have experienced," said Bishop Mark Hagemoen. "I also apologize to all members of our Church whose faith and trust has been damaged because of the sinful actions of those who abused the innocent, and those who covered up such abuse. I recognize that both individual and institutional change must happen in our Church to move forward."

St. Anne's Staff Update

As we continue to be open to the Holy Spirit, I am confident that the Lord is going to lead us in bold and new directions with a gentle hand.
