Live in Love -Sr. Dianne Bergant, CSA

Now that's an exhortation that should be easy to follow because everyone wants to love and to be loved. However, it's not as easy as it appears. Today's second reading contains a list of offenses against love: "Bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling" (Ephesians 4:31). Even those we should love the most can so annoy us that we lose control and might respond with bitterness or shouting. Furthermore, this exhortation is difficult because we are told to refrain from such anger toward people we don't even know or those we don't like. We are to show kindness toward everyone. How can we ever do this? We might not have the courage or the desire. We are, after all, just weak human beings. True, but we have been "sealed for the day of redemption" with the "holy Spirit of God" (Ephesians 4:30). For the Jewish people, the Spirit of God referred to the dynamic power of God at work in the world. This means that the dynamic power of God is with us to transform us from bitter, angry people to be "imitators of God, as beloved children" (Ephesians 5:1). Because this is the case, because this transforming power is available to us, why don't we allow it to transform us and, in so doing, transform our world? Why is the world in such disarray? Why is there so much violence, oppression, and despair? Why are the most vulnerable among us often preyed upon? If we so desperately want to give and receive love, then why don't we? ☺

Sanctuary Changes Update: Thank you to everyone for your prayerful discernment and thoughtful feedback on the proposed concept designs for the sanctuary development. We have taken the time to read your responses and incorporate your feedback into our next steps. In reviewing the responses, it was clear that two conceptual designs were shown overall preference: "Anne and Joachim" and "Rose Window." The next steps will be for the artists to rework them in light of the constructive feedback given by you, the parish, to better reflect our collective vision. An artist will also be creating a new, stripped back conceptual design of how the sanctuary space might look with a less dramatic change, while still moving a second tabernacle into the sanctuary area. Once all 3 designs are completed, they will all be rendered through the same program, giving them consistent visual quality. The 3 designs will then be presented to the parish for a 2nd round of feedback and will also include a pricing estimate for each design as this may influence parishioners' thoughts and decisions.
