Take to Heart These Words -Sr. Dianne Bergant, CSA

"Hear, O Israel!" (Deuteronomy 6:4) are the first words of the most important declaration of faith for Jewish people, a declaration that is the centerpiece of the morning and evening Jewish prayer services. It is a kind of "pledge of allegiance" that observant Jews say even today, reminding themselves of the uniqueness of their God and the covenantal relationship they have with this God. In it, they confess that the Lord is their God—their only God. Out of reverence, they do not pronounce God's personal name. In its place, they substitute the word Lord. Behind this act of faith is the covenantal promise of God: "I will be your God and you shall be my people" (Jeremiah 7:23).

This covenant carries mutual responsibilities. God will be their God and will be faithful to all that this blessing entails. As God's people, they will live according to the standards established by God, witnessing to the world the holiness in life lived for and with God. They are to love God with all their hearts, souls, and strength.

Jesus did not change this declaration in any way. It is at the heart of the Christian way of life as well. What Jesus did was throw light on the meaning of living for and with God, of loving the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and strength. He insists that to love God is to love others, and to love them as we love ourselves. "Hear, O Israel!... Take to heart these words" (Deuteronomy 6:4, 6).

A note regarding our Eucharistic Chapel

In August, a decision was made to add a tabernacle into the sanctuary of the main worship space, in order to both be in line with diocesan directives as well as facilitating the flow of the Mass. There was a desire as well to retain the Eucharistic Chapel as a more intimate, comfortable, and welcoming space where people could come and pray at anytime throughout the day. And so our goal has been to create two distinct spaces within the church: the larger worship area,



which is for all of our regular Mass times; and a smaller more intimate setting for personal prayer or smaller prayer gatherings. To make this distinction more evident, we will be lowering curtains over the glass dividers to separate the two spaces. Also, in the coming weeks, further changes will be made to make the Eucharistic Chapel as welcoming and inviting as possible.

To this end, we would ask that parishioners no longer use the Eucharistic Chapel as an "overflow" as the space will no longer be conducive to that purpose. For those who prefer to keep their distance from others during Mass, we would kindly ask you to use the south side of the church as it is normally less crowded than the rest of the pews. We thank you for your willingness and understanding during this time of change. Feel free to reach out with any questions or concerns you might have.
