Bishop's Annual Appeal 2024 "On the Pilgrimage of Hope"

This year's BAA goal is \$1.4 million, to support a range of ministries and programs that offer hope and proclaim Jesus Christ and God's kingdom.

Prison Ministry (the Office of Restorative Ministry) is supported by gifts to the Bishop's Annual Appeal!

Restorative MInistry Coordinator Dianne Anderson offers Catholic outreach at the Saskatoon Correctional Centre, providing support, prayer and healing to inmates, as well as to families, victims, volunteers, and parishes, striving to build an accepting, connected community.

Outreach - The diocesan Restorative Ministry Office offers prayer opportunities, healing circles, Returning to Spirit sessions, parenting classes, and one-on-one conversation with men seeking healing and prayer. Volunteers are always needed (support and training are provided.) Monetary donations are again being collected to purchase identical small Christmas gifts for inmates as a way to share the joy of Christ, and to let the men know they are not forgotten.

Helping to keep families connected - A Bedtime Story Project is designed to help men in prison stay connected to family, through videotaped bedtime stories. Men approved for the parenting program are videotaped reading a bedtime story, which is then sent home in a donated backpack along with donated pyjamas (newborn to size 12), along with a copy of the book.
