
Jubilee 2025: Pilgrims of Hope – Pope Francis will open the Jubilee Year on Christmas Eve, Dec. 24, 2024. In the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon, Bishop Mark Hagemoen will launch the Jubilee Year with celebration of the Eucharist on the Feast of the Holy Family at 5 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 28 at Holy Spirit Church, 114 Kingsmere Place in Saskatoon. In cathedrals around the world, there will be special Jubilee 2025 Masses celebrated on Sunday, Dec. 29. Both the Cathedral of the Holy Family and St. Paul Co-Cathedral will mark the opening of Jubilee 2025 with special prayers on that Sunday – all are welcome to attend. Canadian Martyrs Relic Tour - Major relics of the Canadian Martyrs, including the skull of St. Jean de Brébeuf and bones of St. Charles Garnier and St. Gabriel Lalemant, will be travelling across Canada for the first time. The relics have resided principally at the National Shrine to the Canadian Martyrs in Midland, ON. Also part of the national tour will be a relic of St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Indigenous North American saint, who was canonized in 2012 and is a beloved patron of the First Nations peoples. The national relic tour begins at the Catholic Christian Outreach "Rise Up" conference in Calgary on New Year's Eve, before continuing across Canada in 2025, including a stop at the Cathedral of the Holy Family in Saskatoon on Jan. 24: mark your calendars and watch for more details.
