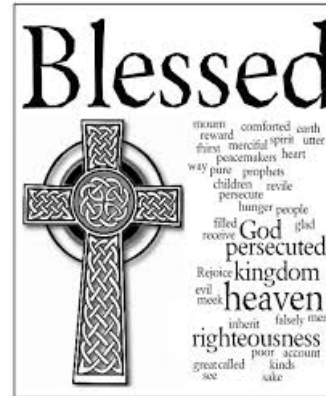

**Sunday Readings:** **Jeremiah 17:5-8** *Blessed are those who trust in the Lord... They are like a tree planted beside the waters.* **1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20** *Now Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.* **Luke 6:17, 20-26** *And raising his eyes toward his disciples [Jesus] said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours."*

Sometimes it can be difficult to imagine why Jesus faced suffering and death. Often there is a popular idea that would have Jesus preaching only love, peace, kindness, and lilies of the field. The thinking goes that in the face of such preaching he was put to death by those who were against love, peace, and kindness. Such is too facile an explanation. Jesus' preaching was certainly about love, but it was about much more. Somebody preaching love is no threat to the establishment, no threat to the powerful. Somebody preaching love can easily be dismissed as a dreamer and best left alone. Today's gospel gives us some of Jesus' preaching that likely created enemies for himself. His preaching favored the poor, hungry, weeping, and hated. He upended not only ancient cultural norms and values but modern ones too. Rather than simply give a verbal pat on the head to those on the bottom rungs of society, he also pulls down the mighty and issues woes that apply just as much to us as they did to those in power in antiquity. In so doing, Jesus creates enemies, not of the poor but of the powerful. It is they who will ultimately put him to death. But as we know, his suffering and death is not the end. God raises him up to glory, giving us the paschal mystery. His followers find themselves allied with those blessed by Jesus.

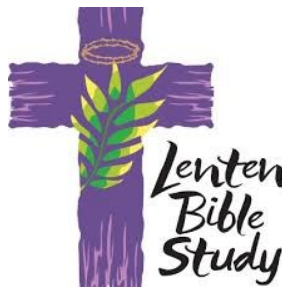

#### 2018 Charitable Giving Tax Receipts from the Catholic Foundation

We have developed a new way of receipting that we hope will be more efficient and better for donors. Instead of issuing separate receipts for each fund or collection to which you have made a gift (e.g. BAA, Priests' Pension, Restorative Ministry, etc.), we will now be sending one receipt for your entire giving amount. Along with the receipt will be a report outlining the gift breakdown. So now two pages replace possibly three or more. This will also save postage and envelopes as receipts for some of the smaller or less frequent collections were previously mailed to parishioners. Foundation receipts will be enclosed with parish offertory receipts.
